I am a Hong Kong based artist and educator with a background in both the arts and sciences. I have taught in the classroom for eleven years (K, G1, Art K-5) and led art workshops for K-12 students and fellow educators.

Having lived in Canada, Taiwan, the US and Hong Kong, I am fascinated with narratives of self/place along with the boundaries of relationships between the mathematical/abstract of the natural world. I enjoy creating with and in nature and hope that in doing so, more people will notice, value and care for what surrounds us —our natural environment, our neighbourhoods, our home.

I completed an art residency in Chiang Mai, Thailand in the fall of 2014 where I worked mainly with the cyanotype process in mapping the natural landscape of the neighbourhood. I also created work with found plant materials and experimented with natural pigments. I facilitated various groups in exploring the identity of place, the meaning of home and memories of childhood.

In the summer of 2015, I was selected for an art and science residency with *The Arctic Circle*. I partnered with seven classrooms in Hong Kong and Canada on *We Go North*, an Arctic exploration project with explorers designed by students to take part in the expedition.

2016 led to a three month residency in Hong Kong at Kadoorie Farm and Botanic Garden. This provided the time to work on my *Botanical Banquet* project as well as explore the farm areas and trails, collect plant material and inspiration, guide school groups, lead walk-in activities at the arthouse, and take part in the KFBG annual autumn festival.

Time outside of the classroom has enabled me to expand my personal art making and learning and connected me with artists from around the world. I'm excited for future opportunities to continue sharing my inspiration, facilitate creative exploration and engage learners in their discovery and appreciation of the world around us.
